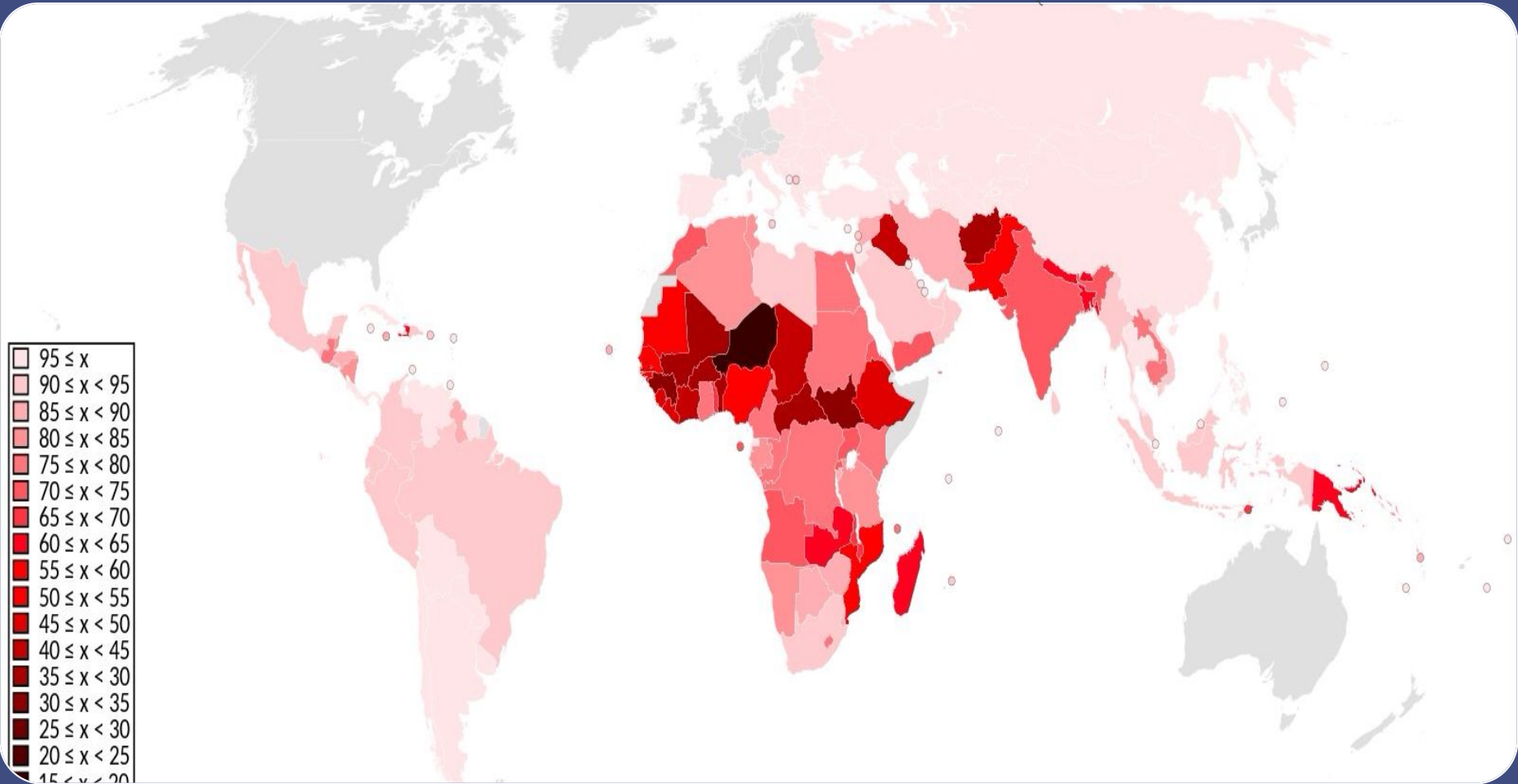

World map of countries by literacy

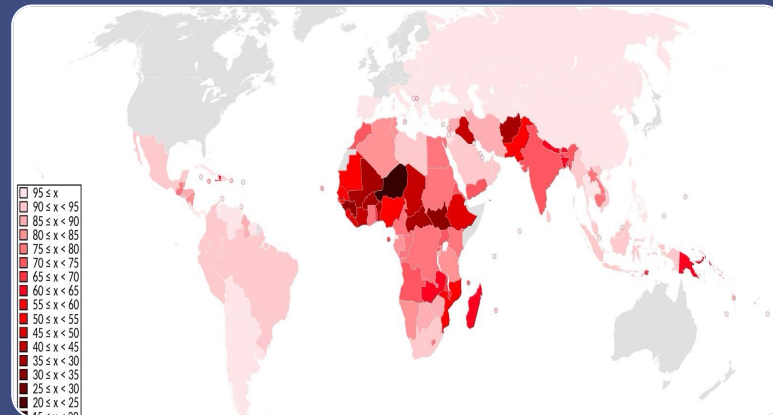


In sub-Saharan Africa, one in three adults cannot read. 48 million young people (aged between 16 and 24) are completely illiterate, and almost one in four school-age children do not attend any kind of school and consequently receive no education.

The literacy rate in the various states reaches unbelievably low and particularly worrying levels. The 13 countries with the lowest literacy rates are all in Africa, the worst being Niger (37%), Mali (39%), Burkina Faso (39%) and Ethiopia (45%).

Illiteracy in Africa therefore remains a widespread and often majority problem in the population.

Going to school and receiving a basic education therefore remains a privilege for the few.

Our ambitious project seeks to address the educational challenges faced by rural and marginalized communities, touching the lives of approximately 1 million beneficiaries, including students, teachers, and school administrators. The scope of our initiative spans across primary and secondary education sectors, as well as the technical and vocational education and training (TVET) sector by financing four different projects all to reach one goal.

Our project



3 Training 2,000 Teachers and 500 Administrators: We will conduct comprehensive training programs for 2,000 teachers and 500 administrators, covering pedagogy, curriculum development, digital literacy, and environmental awareness.




1 Building Renovating 200 Schools: We will enhance the infrastructure of 200 schools, integrating sustainable features like solar panels, rainwater harvesting, energy-efficient lighting, and natural ventilation.


2 Providing 20,000 Scholarships: Our aim is to offer 20,000 scholarships, prioritizing girls, students from low-income households, ethnic minorities, and refugees to foster inclusion and diversity.

4 Distributing 100,000 Textbooks and 20,000 Digital Devices: Bridging educational gaps, we plan to distribute 100,000 textbooks and 20,000 digital devices, including tablets and laptops, to enhance learning opportunities.
